Health and Safety Policy

General

The Event Organiser, Helen Bell, has overall responsibility for health and safety during the event. To assist, she has appointed a Health and Safety Steward, Harry Parks, to ensure compliance with Health and Safety legislation.

The Organiser undertakes to run the competition in accordance with the British Eventing rules and guidance.

The Organiser shall ensure that all Chief Stewards are aware of and understand the relevant section of the BE guidance to ensure they comply with the requirements and standards for their area of responsibility.

The Health and Safety Steward shall ensure, so far as reasonable and practicable, that the area of competition and area accessible to the public and other Officials are subject to a risk assessment and that this, with a record of the actions taken, is documented in the event's Health and Safety Plan.

Officials

Stewards, judges and officials shall be briefed on their duties and provided with the relevant resources to carry them.

They shall bring to the attention of the Health and Safety Steward any concerns they have for the Health, Safety and Welfare of the public and the officials.

They shall bring to the attention of the BE Technical Adviser or Steward any concerns they may have for the Health, Safety and Welfare of the competitors.

They shall maintain and manage themselves in their area of responsibility in such a manner as to ensure that no additional hazards are created.

The BE Technical Adviser, BE Steward or Health and Safety Steward are required to ensure the Officials are properly briefed on their duties and are properly equipped.

Spectators

All reasonable and practical steps are taken to ensure the health, safety and welfare of spectators at the event.

Spectators shall be encouraged to view the online programme containing a map showing the different parts of the event site and suitable viewing locations.

Spectators shall be directed by signs to the various areas and facilities (e.g. Competition areas, information points, toilets, first aid points or cross country course.)

Spectators shall be prevented from straying inadvertently into the path of oncoming horses by defined crossing points, signage, stringing, whistle blasts or public address announcements.

Contractors

Contractors at the Event are required to observe best working practices, comply with all legislation relevant to their business and take all reasonable and practical steps to safeguard themselves, their employees, competitors, officials and spectators attending. A risk assessment and a copy of Public Liability Insurance shall be provided to the Health and Safety Steward prior to work at the event.

Exhibitors/Trade Stands

All exhibitors/trade stands are responsible for the safety of their own stands and the risks they may pose to other persons within the allocated space or immediate surrounding areas. They shall ensure compliance with all statutory legislation regarding equipment testing, staff training and equipment erection. A risk assessment and copy of Public Liability Insurance shall be provided to the Health and Safety Steward prior to arrival o- site Permission shall be sought from the Health and Safety Steward if an exhibition/ trade stand wishes to dismantle their stand/ equipment while the public and /or competitors may be present. The exhibitor/trade stand is responsible for all product liability in line with their statutory duties tinder trade description legislation.

Emergencies

The emergency services at the event include doctors, paramedics, vets, ambulances and fence repair personnel. They have access to all parts of the site and can be contacted promptly through any steward, judge or official. Person radios will be issued. Accidents involving horses and competitors shall be dealt with through the nearest judge/steward with immediate contact to appropriate BE officials, and emergency services. Falls and injuries shall be reported and documented. Emergencies involving the public shall be managed as appropriate to ensure the best care is provided through coordination with the Health and Safety Steward and emergency services.

Safety Information

The Organiser of this event advises that on parts the ground may be irregular or uneven. As a result site areas may not be suitable for those spectators who suffer from certain medical conditions and disabilities. All spectators attend the event at their own risk and are advised to wear suitable footwear. The Organiser shall not incur any liability, except as required by law, in respect of any injury or damage the spectators or their property how so ever caused.

- Spectators with a disability please ask at the Information Point for information and assistance.
- All dogs must be kept on leads at all times.
- Anyone requiring First Aid should go to the Information Point.
- All persons attending the event must use crossing points when on the Cross Country course.
- Watch out for horses at all times and listen for the Whistle,

Disclaimer of Liability

Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers of this event, nor British Eventing, nor any agent, employee, or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, rider, spectators, land cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way.

Reservation of Right

The Organiser has the right

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of a class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry

Disclaimer of Liability

The Organiser of the event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all responsible precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organiser and all the Officials and Stewards.

Forbidding Assistance

Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not, with the object of facilitating the task of the rider or helping his/her horse, is forbidden, under penalty of elimination, at the discretion of the BE Steward. In particular, it is forbidden for a fence judge or official to call back or assist a competitor by directions, to ratify an error of course.

Reporting to Doctor

Riders must be aware that rider falls in any phase of BE Competition now results in compulsory elimination. Any rider who sustains a fall must follow the directions of the Event Doctor at all times. If the Competitor has not been examined by an Event Doctor after the fall, he/she must not take part in any further phase or competition until he/she has been examined and allowed to continue. If the rider falls in the warm-up phase of any part of the competition he/she must not remount until he/she has been examined by an Event Doctor and allowed to continue. If the doctor has not allowed him/her to continue on that or any other horse, he/she must withdraw that horse from the competition and if he/she has other rides at the event, those horses must also be withdrawn or other arrangements made. If the doctor imposes any conditions before a Competitor may continue on other horses which may have time implications, the Competitor must immediately inform and liaise with the relevant event officials. Under no circumstances must a Competitor leave the Event site after a fall until he/she has been examined by an Event Doctor. It is the responsibility of the Competitor to ensure compliance with these rules. Failure to do so is likely to incur a disciplinary sanction.

Motorbike and All-Terrain Vehicles

The use of motorbikes and all-terrain vehicles is banned except for authorised officials. Anyone found riding a motorbike or all-terrain vehicle without permission will be asked to leave the event.
